We were immensely proud to receive the prestigious Artsmark Gold Award for outstanding commitment to education of the Arts.

<u>Artsmark</u> is Arts Council England's accreditation granted to schools in the UK that champion cultural education. It celebrates schools that go above and beyond in promoting creativity, developing talent, and fostering an appreciation for the arts among pupils.

To achieve this, we have developed the arts and culture provision at the school and embedded it in a broad and balanced curriculum. A focus on the Arts has promoted positive mental health and wellbeing throughout the college, nurturing emotional wellbeing, self-expression and personal growth, which played a role in us securing the esteemed accolade.

We are proud to have a high uptake of students embarking on their creative studies, with a selection of Arts and Culture subjects on offer, including Acting Masterclasses and 3D Printing. We have also engaged with the Cambridgeshire Music Hub and with Ramsey Rural Museum to provide enriching visits that engross students in cultural experiences and encourage them to explore their artistic talents.

Pride Month - June 2023

The Stonewall Riots took place on June 28th 1969 in New York City. In the 1960s America was not open to same-sex relationships and in some places it was even illegal.

Despite this, LGBTQ+ friendly bars and clubs started opening as a safe place for individuals to take refuge. However, the New York State Liquor Authority would shut down any establishments that sold alcohol to known or suspected LGBTQ+ individuals because they deemed it "disorderly".

In June 1989, the Police raided one of the largest LGBTQ+ friendly establishments in New York, the Stonewall Inn, and arrested thirteen people. After constant harassment and discrimination, this raid was the final straw and instead of everyone dispersing, they began throwing rocks, pennies and bottles at the police officers.

This led to many more riots around the country. Stonewall also ended up hosting the first Pride Parade a year later. While this incident may have not started the Gay Rights movement, it definitely boosted its presence and helped raise awareness to it.

Why have Pride Month?

We believe it's important to celebrate Pride Month to support those in the LGBTQ+ community and raise awareness.

In Britain, 42% of LGBTQ+ school pupils have been bullied in school over the past year, half of LGBTQ+ pupils hear homophobia frequently at school and seven in ten football fans have heard or witnessed homophobia in stadiums.

Globally, it is illegal to be in a same sex relationship in 70 countries and in 11 of those countries the punishment is death penalty. A quarter of the world's population believes that being part of the LGBTQ+ community should be a crime.
