We have started seeing Year 11 students for their Careers Guidance interviews, all Year 11 students will be seen between October 2023 and January 2024. For students that are wanting to study courses at college, just a reminder that you can apply from now, you will still have a meeting with Ms. Pollard, but it is best to send in your application as soon as possible. It can be a weight off your mind to have sent your applications, and even get replies confirming your place, early in the year. If you require help applying to college or are not yet sure what you want to do, then please send Mrs Wilson a Teams message and I will book you in for a priority meeting with Ms. Pollard.

<u>WHAT ARE CAREERS GUIDANCE INTERVIEWS?</u>

These are confidential, 1:1 impartial guidance sessions for all Year 11 students. We can also help with college applications if needed (we just need a note from a Parent/ Carer to say they are happy for us to help).

<u>WHY DO WE HAVE THEM?</u>

To discuss every student's Post 16 options and to support them in making decisions about their next steps.

WHO PERFORMS THE INTERVIEW?

All guidance interviews are performed by our qualified Careers Advisor- Ms Pollard

WHAT HAPPENS AFTER THE INTERVIEW?

Ms Pollard will type up notes of the discussion and then Mrs Wilson will send the student a copy of these notes for reference. Any follow up actions will be included in the notes.

OPTIONS AT THE END OF YEAR 11

For those of you who may choose to spend time over your Christmas break thinking about what you want to do after Year 11, it is important to remember that, as well as the academic subjects you are studying now, there are a lot of other subjects you can consider which are more vocational or technical including Diplomas and T levels. Don't forget that as well as staying on at Ramsey Gatehouse Sixth Form or moving to somewhere new to continue in full time education you can carry on learning through an Apprenticeship which allows you to both get qualifications and earn an income.
