World Book Day

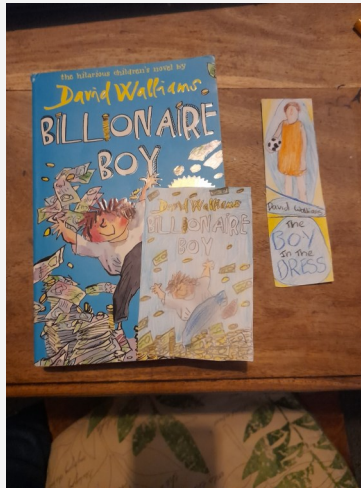
On the 4th of March, we celebrated World Book Day!

Curriculum Focus: PE

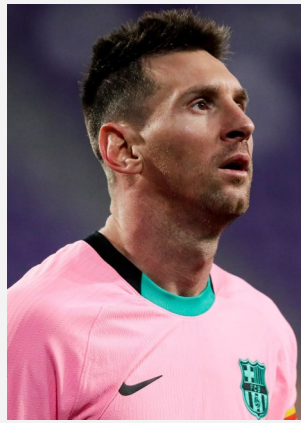
