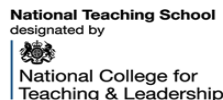

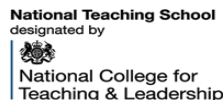

Certain universities will ask for specific subjects:

Economics want maths; very rarely do they ask for economics

Criminology want English (possibly psychology)

Pharmacy must have Chemistry, plus at least one from biology, maths or physics

Taking certain A-levels will open up more university courses to you:

Facilitating subjects are: Biology, Chemistry, English, Geography, History, Maths, Physics, French, Spanish

A-levels are a lot tougher than GCSEs

The reasons to choose them are: you need the course for your future career, you're good at it, you think you'll enjoy it

Some courses and universities may have a list of subjects they don't accept

Combine subjects with the facilitating subjects above to keep your options open

How the course is organised

- ▶ Year 12 - students refine their drawing and painting skills and experience a variety of materials through workshops and guided study.
 - ▶ Towards Term 2, Students begin their personal investigation
- ▶ In year 13, students will complete 2 components:
 - ▶ Component 1 - a Personal Investigation of their choosing. Students are responsible for researching artists and materials relevant to their topic. This is worth 60% of overall grade.
 - ▶ Component 2 - an externally set assignment where students are given topics to research and a 15 hour final piece of artwork. Worth 40% of overall grade.

CAN I APPLY IF I DIDN'T TAKE GCSE ART & DESIGN?

- ▶ **YES!**
- ▶ **HOWEVER** YOU WILL HAVE TO SUBMIT A PORTFOLIO OF ARTWORK TO BE CONSIDERED FOR THE A-LEVEL ART AND DESIGN PROGRAM.

WHAT PRIOR KNOWLEDGE DO I NEED?

- 30% of A-level

This component is marked by teachers and moderated by AQA.

Component 3: Making theatre (practical)

What's assessed

- Practical exploration and interpretation of three extracts (Extract 1, 2 and 3) each taken from a different play
- Methodology of a prescribed practitioner must be applied to Extract 3
- Extract 3 is to be performed as a final assessed piece (students may contribute as performer, designer or director)
- Reflective report analysing and evaluating theatrical interpretation of all three extracts

How it's assessed

- Performance of Extract 3 (40 marks)
- Reflective report (20 marks)
- 60 marks in total
- 30% of A-level

This component is marked by AQA.
