

Year 7 Newsletter 02nd November 2023


September 5th seems so long ago, your child's first day at secondary school.

Homework

Year 7 will now receive sanctions if homework is not completed.

Please see homework expectations for maths and science below:

Maths is set and due in every Thursday for all groups. It is on Eedi and is also posted on Teams. As well as the assigned quizzes, there are retrieval activities that pop up to remind students about topics they have studied throughout the year. Students are not sanctioned for not completing the retrieval activities but they will get spirit points if they do complete them. They are expected to do some writing in their books. If students do not know their password, they should see their subject teacher or I can reset them during breaks

Science: Tassomai daily goals. Students can complete one a day or all four on the same day. If less than four goals are completed in a week, sanctions will be issued. If students have forgotten their Tassomai password, they can ask their subject teacher or see me during breaks.

I will be responding to some of the feedback in the next Newsletter.


Year 7 Spirit : Behaviour ratio
