Please only call the main Reception number in an emergency or if a situation cannot wait, for example, if you need to inform your child of a change to travel arrangements for getting home. Teachers are unable to receive phone calls during the school day. If you do call the school, Reception staff will take a message and pass it to the person best suited to help you.

There is an expectation that staff will respond to you in a timely manner. May I request that, if you email a member of staff and don't receive a response within the timeframe stated within the policy, please use the Parent Forum Guarantee and I will follow this up.

The Parent Forum Guarantee gives all parents the right to speak directly to me, the Headteacher, within 24 hours, if you feel your question has not been answered by those you have already contacted.

You will be contacted initially to arrange a convenient time for your call and then I will personally call you by the end of the next working/school day. If you would like a follow up meeting, this can occur within 72 hours after the initial phone call.

### **Parent Forum Update**

We are currently in the process of planning the meeting dates for this academic year and will provide more information once this has been agreed.

### Is your child eligible for Free school meals?

If you apply and qualify for Free School Meals, your child's school will receive additional funding called Pupil Premium. Schools spend the pupil premium money on anything that can help your children do well at school, including trips, activities and extra support. Applying online only takes a few minutes and, if eligible, your child will continue to receive Free School Meals until the end of Year 11 even if your income rises above the threshold at any point during that time.

To get free school meals you need to be receiving one of the following:

- Universal Credit (up to £7,400 net earned income)
- Income Support
- Income based Job Seeker's Allowance
- Income related Employment and Support Allowance
- Working Tax Credit run-on (paid for 4 weeks after you stop working altogether or start to work less than 16 hours per week)
- Child Tax Credit but no element of Working Tax Credit and have an annual income that does not exceed £16,190

### How we are teaching?

In lessons at the moment teachers are working on helping students to master the subject before moving on to new topics. We use a variety of ways to do this; many subjects start lessons with a retrieval task that invites students to recall knowledge from the previous lesson, month or earlier in their school journey. We know that this helps them embed the knowledge and also helps teachers to know what aspects of our curriculum need to be revisited before we move on in the learning. Please do ask your son or daughter about what they have learnt recently, but also what they remember from previous parts of their learning; it will help them to remember long term.

### Safety

**This week...** we have been talking to students about who they can speak to at school if they have any worries or concerns. We have reminded students that every member of staff at school has been trained to help and support.

Your child's form tutors are a great first contact point as they meet them every morning and would be a good place to start if they were feeling worried.

We also have a Student Support Team where students can report unkindness or other concerns connected to behaviour. Our Welfare department are great at supporting students with anxiety or welfare concerns, parents or students can contact them via email on <a href="welfare@abbeycollege.cambs.sch.uk">welfare@abbeycollege.cambs.sch.uk</a>. Students can also teams chat with them, drop them a note or turn up at the Welfare office before school, at break or lunch or afterschool.

### **Electrical Safety – E Bikes and E Scooters**

You may be aware of a house fire that occurred in Cambridge at the end of June 2023 which sadly took the lives of two children and their mother. It is believed that the house fire was caused by an escooter charger/battery. The online home fire safety check is a useful tool, not only does it give advice using a risk matrix, it also can be used as a referral tool for us to send face to face specialist officers to a property if members of the public would like a visit.

### Assessment: How your child is doing?

- Edulink: All parents should now have access to Edulink, if your link does not work or has
  expired then contact <u>wsloan@abbeycollege.cambs.sch.uk</u> or
  <u>linda.bennett@abbeycollege.cambs.sch.uk</u>. It is particularly important that once in you
  check, and if needed, update the account information.
- Year 7 baseline tests: full details of the CAT4 (aptitude), Maths, English and science tests, including the dates, were released earlier this week by letter. No revision is needed for these tests and class teachers will accompany the students to the examination hall.
- Year 7 and 8 will be sitting the New Group Reading Tests, NGRT during English lessons from 02.10.02. The data from these tests is used to determine those students in need of reading intervention and the progress of the whole school Literacy programme.
- The **Year 9 data drop** window opens on 02.10.23 with reports issued on 13.10.23. Reports will include a Spirit score and information about barriers to learning. A current grade and an end of Year 11 target grade will be released in January 2024 after formal assessments have taken place.
- The **Year 10 data drop** window opens on 02.10.23 with reports issued on 13.10.23. Reports will include a current grade, Spirit score and an end of Year 11 target grade. The current grade will be based on work completed in the autumn term and students will not be setting formal assessments until February 2024.
- Year 11 data capture information including end of year Teacher Set Targets, Professional Predictions for use in college applications and Spirit will be released on Friday and available on Saturday morning.

- The **Year 12** assessment window opens on 02.10.23 with reports issued just before half term. Details of the assessments and revision lists will start appearing on Teams shortly.
- Year 13 data capture information including Barriers to Learning, the Teacher set Target grade and a Professional prediction for use on UCAS applications will be released on 06.10.23.
