


Homework

This week we have been sharing the reasons we set homework with students, which is all about helping them retain information long-term. One of the ideas shared was.

We know that by re-working information after a lesson helps the brain to remember more long term, which supports students to make more rapid progress. We also explained to students where to get support if they are struggling.

Here is what some of our students said after their assembly:

- "I learnt today that homework is important because it helps us to remember."
- "It is important to do homework to expand your learning and so you don't forget it."
- "It is important as when you get older you forget things you have learnt, if you do it at home you are more likely to remember them."
- "As we get older we need to take our learning home so we can still remember it as our teenage brain is developing."
- "It helps with revision."

Assessment calendar: How your child is doing?

- Year 11 assemblies are currently all centred on students improving their grades. The Year 11 reports just published on Edulink show current and target grades for all subjects. Current grades represent the starting point for this year. Find out if your child has looked at their report on Edulink, it is much easier for them to know which subjects to prioritise if they know their starting points. In the run up to November Trials we will be revising topics and covering content relevant to the trials, if students are making progress they will be able to discuss the work with you. Ask them about it! and about the revision techniques they are currently using.
- The Year 7 progress tests in English, Maths and Science have been sent away to be externally marked. The results should be in school before Christmas and will be emailed home in December.
- Year 7 and 8 reading tests will be happening in school next week. The results are used to
 identify students who need literacy support. Parents will be contacted by letter if
 interventions are planned for their child, the interventions are scheduled to
 start immediately after half term.
