Uniform: Jewellery and Socks

Next week, we will be focusing our daily uniform checks on jewellery and white socks. Our uniform expectations are in place to ensure equality among students and also to ensure that students arrive in school ready to learn. Our Uniform Policy states that trousers should be worn with black socks and our expectations around jewellery are as follows:

- No visible bangles, bracelets or necklaces.
- One small plain ring per hand
- No facial piercings (eyebrows, tongue, lip or chin) except a small discreet nose stud.
- One small stud or hoop in each ear under ½ cm in size
- Ear stretchers are not permitted

Any student found not following this code will be issued with a 'tell' and have the items of jewellry confiscated until the end of the day. We would really value your support in ensuring that your child/ren come in to school each day in the correct uniform.
