# Update letter for families – 10<sup>th</sup> December

On Wednesday 8 December, the Prime Minister announced the implementation of <u>Plan B of the COVID-19</u> <u>Response: Autumn and Winter Plan,</u> to reduce pressure on the NHS. Plan B sets out a number of additional measures across society to control transmission of COVID-19, which are already in place within schools.

The Government is clear on the critical importance of not disrupting the education of children and young people and the Government will prioritise keeping all schools open. By way of a summary, the main points are below:

- Attendance School attendance remains mandatory;
- Face coverings Face coverings should be worn by pupils and students in year 7 and above, staff and visitors in communal areas and on school transport, unless exempt.
- Isolation All individuals who have been identified as a close contact of a suspected or confirmed case of the Omicron variant of COVID-19, irrespective of vaccination status and age, will continue to be required to self-isolate and asked to book a PCR test. The Government plans to introduce Daily Contact Testing as soon as possible as an alternative to self-isolation for contacts of positive Omicron cases who are fully vaccinated or under the age of 18 years and 6 months.
- Testing Please encourage your child(ren) to test twice a week and to record their results on <u>TestRegister</u> as well as the <u>NHS Results Website</u>
- January return All students are expected to take an LFD test prior to their return on 5<sup>th</sup> January. We have asked families if they prefer for their child(ren) to be tested on-site test during the w/c 5<sup>th</sup> January, as this will determine whether we need to implement staggered starts for year groups and increase our onsite testing capacity. If you have not done so already, please complete this <u>survey</u> by no later than Sunday 12<sup>th</sup> December 2021. Testing in school helps to boost participation and will help reduce transmission after a period of mixing over the holidays.

## Last Day of Term 17<sup>th</sup> December

We are very excited to be holding a Christmas Market on the last day of term. The Year 9 Student Leadership Team are coordinating the event with the help of Miss Dowd, and students from each year group are organising stalls to raise money for charity. Students will finish at the earlier time of 1pm.

In addition, Friday 17th December will also be a <u>non-uniform day</u> for students as a reward for reducing the number of *tells* received over the last two weeks. We are asking students to pay £1 to wear non-uniform and the Year 10 student voice group are deciding on which charity this money will go to. We ask that students dress appropriately and avoid wearing any revealing clothing.



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### **Break and Lunchtime**

We have had to make some changes to our break and lunchtime arrangements in response to the new Covid variant. This means that more students will spend their break and lunchtimes outside. We are encouraging students to make sure they have a warm coat in school so that they are comfortable during their break times. Please remember that we do not allow hoodies as an extra layer in school. We plan to rotate the break and lunchtime indoor areas so that no year group will be disadvantaged by the restrictions that we have had to put in place owing to Covid.

#### **Reporting incidents on the bus**

We expect the same high standards of behaviour from students on buses as we do within the school. When we receive reports of poor behaviour on the bus, we investigate and issue sanctions in line with our school policy. If your child experiences any problems on the bus then please report them to us using the <u>link</u> on our website.

### **Teaching and Learning update**

Staff are reviewing how we give feedback in lessons, and how we help students to understand their learning. We are experimenting with different ways to do this, such as using reflection sheets. Please do ask your son(s)/ daughter(s) about their experiences of reflection activities to date. Students have been working very hard this term and have been answering the many questions put to them. We are focusing next term on how teachers use questions in class to develop challenge, so you will be hearing more about this after Christmas.



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### Assessment

- Unfortunately, owing to the new Covid restrictions, we have moved the Year 11 Results Release Event to
  period 5 on Thursday. This means that students will collect their results without parents present. They
  will receive an envelope containing their current grades, these grades represent what the students have
  achieved in the November Trials.
- To support Year 11 parents who have queries about student progress, we will email a link to a Results Release Form, this will enable families to contact the school with requests for information about the Trial results. We will respond to all requests in the New Year.
- The Year 11 Progress Reports will be published on the Sims app on 17.12.21. The Progress Reports will contain; the current grade, which is a measure of attainment and could be used to generate Teacher Assessed Grades (TAGs); the Professional Predictions, for use in college applications and the Teacher Set Target grades generated in September. Progress made since the end of Year 10 trials will be measured.
