# **Update letter for families – 17th December**

We wrote to you <u>yesterday</u> regarding the latest Covid situation within schools and how the new self-isolation processes will work. It is probably a fair assumption, that with all the mixing that will take place over the holidays, Covid infection rates are likely to increase, and the first half term of 2022 will be a challenge for us all. With this in mind, it is <u>vital that students test at home before they return to school on</u> the 5<sup>th</sup> January 2022.

The Government have stressed the best defence against the new strain is to obtain a vaccination, and they plan to roll out the second dosage for 12-15 year olds from Monday 20th December. We have been informed that in-school vaccinations will be before the end of next half term. Families are reminded that they can have their child vaccinated at a local vaccination site, by booking an appointment using the National Booking Service here: www.nhs.uk/conditions/coronavirus-covid-19/coronavirus-vaccination/

Our <u>Covid Contingency Plans</u> have been updated ready for the January return and reflect the latest guidance. We are not expecting any scheduled announcements from the Government during the Christmas break, but of course, we have been here before, and I will keep you posted should anything change. However, in any case, this week students have been reminded of the process to access blended learning should they need to self-isolate in the future. #### **Outdoor clothing**



Our <u>Uniform Policy</u> states that any make up should be natural and that students are not permitted to wear nail varnish. Therefore, if your child has acrylic nails or eyelash extensions applied over the holiday period, they must remove it prior to our return to school on the 5<sup>th</sup> January 2022.

- The Year 11 Trial 1 Progress Reports were published yesterday. Progress made since the end of Year 10 trials is measured. They contain:
  - the Current Grade, which is a measure of attainment and could be used to generate TAGs;
  - the Professional Predictions, for use in college applications and the Teacher Set Target Grades generated in September.
