

Anti-bullying update: Safer Internet Day

Tuesday 8th February is *Safer Internet Day* and this year's theme is 'Respect and Relationships' online. Students will be exploring this issue in their Social Studies lessons next week, focusing on the impact that negative online behaviour can have on mental health. This is particularly important for us, as following the school closures we have seen an increase in the number of students visiting our Welfare Team about unkind or abusive online posts and messages.

In order to support students with this, we have made a change to our anti-bullying and behaviour policies respectively, so that 'any malicious online communication directed at a member of our school community will be sanctioned in the same way as unkindness that takes place in school.' The process for students is below, and we will share this during next week's Social Studies lessons, in addition to reminding them that no form of bullying is tolerated at Abbey College.



Governor update

It was good to have Governors visit our school on several occasions over the past two weeks, meeting Subject Leaders to review their strengths and areas for improvement. Governors set challenges for leaders and arranged follow-up visits to monitor their actions.

The primary role of a governor is to challenge and support the school leadership. However, they offer so much more, such as: providing professional knowledge (based on their own work experiences), coaching and mentoring, monitoring how the school is improving, collecting first-hand information and engaging with the community. There is an opportunity to meet some governors during our forthcoming Year 8 Option Information Evening to ask any school-related questions, or to enquire about the possibility of working as a governor. 
