

<p><b>What you gained in Year 7</b></p> <p>You studied the big picture of British History from medieval period to the Industrial Revolution and were introduced to ways of explaining the past (the BAT system &amp; PEAL paragraphs) and historical sources &amp; sites (the TANK system).</p>	<p><b>What you missed in Year 7</b></p> <p>You studied Ramsey and the Cromwell family in the Early Modern Period, the Industrial Revolution and the British Empire at home, but didn't have any face to face teaching on these topics, so we did not get to spend quite as much time on the final topic as we would have liked.</p>
<p><b>Curriculum Update History Year 8</b></p>	
<p><b>How we'll catch you up</b></p> <p>We'll spend more time from previous years in your Year 8 lessons developing your skills as historians. If it is practical, we'll take you on visits to more historic sites in the Summer term to give you more chance to think about the past in different ways</p>	<p><b>What you will study in Year 8</b></p> <p>We'll take a closer look at modern history:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>The First World War</li> <li>The Second World War</li> <li>Nazi Germany</li> <li>The USSR and the Cold War</li> </ul>

<p><b>What you gained in Year 8</b></p> <p>You took a close look at modern history, studying the World Wars, 20th Century healthcare, Nazi Germany and the Holocaust and the Cold War and the USSR and practised ways of explaining the past (the BAT system &amp; PEAL paragraphs) and historical sources &amp; sites (the TANK system).</p>	<p><b>What you missed in Year 8</b></p> <p>You studied opposition to the Nazis, the Holocaust and the Cold War and the USSR at home, but didn't have any face to face teaching on these topics, so we did not get to spend quite as much time on the final topic as we would have liked.</p>
<p><b>Curriculum Update History Year 9</b></p>	
<p><b>How we'll catch you up</b></p> <p>Year 9 is all about mastering the big picture of the GCSE course, so we'll be revisiting topics that you studied in Year 8, such as people's health through time and Nazi Germany in much more depth. If it is practical, we'll take you on visits to more historic sites in the Summer term to give you more chance to think about the past in different ways</p>	<p><b>What you will study in Year 9</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>People's Health (c.1250 - c.2020)</li> <li>Living under Nazi Rule (1933 - 1945)</li> <li>Viking Expansion (c.750 - c.1050)</li> </ul>

<p><b>What you gained in Year 9</b></p> <p>You completed 2 of the 5 units of the GCSE course (People's Health (c.1250 - c.2020) &amp; Living under Nazi Rule (1933 - 1945)) and have studied 80% of a 3rd unit (Viking Expansion c.750 - c.1050) including practice exam questions throughout the year. This means that we are still on schedule with studying the GCSE course.</p>	<p><b>What you missed in Year 9</b></p> <p>We haven't completed the Viking Expansion (c.750 - c.1050) unit which we would usually finish at the end of Year 9, but there is only one topic to study in this unit ('Kings') and we would prefer to look at this important aspect of the course with you in the autumn.</p>
<p><b>Curriculum Update</b> <b>History</b> <b>Year 10</b></p>	
<p><b>How we'll catch you up</b></p> <p>We will start Year 10 by reviewing the Viking Expansion (c.750 - c.1050) unit which you studied at home &amp; spending some time on developing exam technique. We shall still be on track to complete the last 2 units of the GCSE in Year 10.</p> <p>If it is practical, we'll take you on visits to historic sites in the Summer term to enhance your understanding of the past.</p>	<p><b>What you will study in Year 10</b></p> <p>The final topic - 'Kings' - from Viking Expansion (c.750 - c.1050)</p> <p>The Norman Conquest (1065 - 1087)</p> <p>History around us: The site of Ramsey Abbey (c.969 - c.1600)</p>

<p><b>What you gained in Year 10</b></p> <p>You completed the content of the GCSE course whilst we were still in school and then used the time at home to revise your knowledge of each of the 5 units &amp; practise exam questions for those units where you had identified gaps in your knowledge and understanding. Many of you met a Holocaust survivor online on a Zoom call organised through the Holocaust Memorial Centre.</p>	<p><b>What you missed in Year 10</b></p> <p>While we did complete our fieldwork around Ramsey in February and March, you didn't have the opportunity to visit historic sites in the summer term which is usually part of the Year 10 curriculum and helps you to master the evaluation of evidence.</p>
<p><b>Curriculum Update</b> <b>History</b> <b>Year 11</b></p>	
<p><b>How we'll catch you up</b></p> <p>We will focus on mastering the evaluation of evidence and exam technique every week.</p> <p>If it is practical, we'll take you on visits to historic sites in the Spring term to enhance your understanding of the past ahead of your exams in the Summer.</p>	<p><b>What you will study in Year 11</b></p> <p>We shall revisit every unit of the course with our main focus being exam technique: Viking Expansion (c.750 - c.1050); Living under Nazi Rule (1933 - 1945); People's Health (c.1250 - c.2020); The Norman Conquest (1065 - 1087); History around us - Ramsey Abbey (c.969 - c.1600).</p>
