Remembering The Queen



Everyone at Abbey College are deeply saddened by last Thursday's passing of The Queen and offers its condolences to the Royal Family at this time. From this week onwards, leading up to the funeral, there will be a series of appropriate activities to celebrate her life and explain the significance of her passing. In addition, our Welfare Team are on-hand to support any students who are struggling to manage through this time.

The official date of the State Funeral is 19 September 2022. This day will be a bank holiday and schools will also close as a mark of respect.

In the meantime, our staff will continue to manage school departure by students at the beginning and end of the school day, wearing their high-viz vests. Reporting behaviour



Vaping

Nationally, the number of young people vaping is increasing at a significant rate and has become a growing concern in schools. It is illegal to sell or purchase vapes to anyone under the age of 18.

Vapes and associated items are banned at Abbey College in the same way as all age-restricted items. If we suspect that your child has brought a banned item into school then we will conduct a search in accordance with our Search and Confiscation Policy. Any student found with a vape, or any banned item will face a significant sanction. If you are concerned that your child may be involved in vaping then please contact our Welfare Team who can offer support and quidance.

Curriculum update



Spanish focus

Each week, I intend to highlight what is available on our website to support student learning.

This week, I will focus on Spanish which is a core subject at Abbey College. There are three main resources available on our website for every subject taught. Click each heading below to find out more, or go to our main web page here.

- 1. <u>Spanish Learning Journey</u> an overview of what is taught from year 7 through to year 11. If you click on the image once, it will open. Click on it again, it will enlarge.
- 2. <u>Curriculum overviews and plans for each year group</u> these show in detail what is taught and assessed by year group in detail.
- 3. <u>Knowledge organisers</u> these are useful tools when it comes to learning and recalling information. They are a great resource to see at a glance what facts need to be retained, and are particularly useful prior to an assessment or exam.

Homework update

Lessons at Abbey College have got off to a great start, and it has been lovely to see the enthusiasm of students as they have returned. We hope that this continues as we go through the year.

This academic year we are placing a greater emphasis on homework. It is important that students retain the information they learn in class, so we are introducing **Knowledge and Information Tests (KITS)**. KITs are small, low-stakes questions that will let teachers understand where any misconceptions may be, and will enable staff to redirect students in their thinking and learning. These recall skills will be invaluable as they move through the school and complete external examinations. Students will soon be receiving a Homework Timetable, outlining the expectations for homework completion in each subject per fortnight, and we will send this to you for reference. A letter explaining this in more detail will be sent shortly.

- **Edulink:** All parents should now have access to Edulink, if your link does not work or has expired then contact help@cmat.support. It is particularly important that once in, you check and if needed, update the account information.
- Year 7 baseline tests: full detail of the CAT4, Maths, English and Science tests, including the dates, will be released next week by letter. No revision is required for these tests.
- **Year 11 data capture** information including Techer Set Targets and Spirit Grades will be released in two weeks.
- The **Year 10** assessment window opens on 19.09.22 with reports issued early October. Details of the assessments and revision lists will start appearing on Teams next week.
- The **Year 12 assessment** window opens on 26.09.22 with reports issued just before half term. Details of the assessments and revision lists will start appearing on Teams shortly.
- Year 13 data capture information including Teacher Set Targets and Spirit Grades will be released in early October.
- Year 9 data capture information including Teacher Set Targets will be released just before half term.
- Year 7 and 8 have assessments after half term.

Abbey College Preloved Uniform

Abbey College Parent's Forum runs the Preloved School Uniform scheme as part of its fundraising activities. Clothes are categorised according to condition: excellent/as new, good, or discounted with minor marks.

We list all available stock in real-time on a Google spreadsheet on our <u>Facebook page</u>, Abbey College Parent's Forum. Parents can message to reserve, and the item will be secured until they can pick up. For offline sales, we run one pop up shop per half term and there will always be a changing room available. 
