Homework technical issues for some on Edulink

We are currently experiencing some technical difficulties with the homework function on Edulink which means that homework is not visible on Edulink for some parents and students. (All homework is still visible to students on Teams.) As a result of this issue we are taking the following steps to support students:

- 1. Any outstanding detentions for failure to complete homework have been cancelled.
- 2. Moving forward, you will not receive a notification on Edulink about missing homework until you have received a phone call from our Student Support Team to inform you of the date of the detention.
- 3. When the issue is resolved we will resume detentions for missed homework and we will introduce these one Year Group at a time to allow students to adjust to the system.


