Of course, we want the positive responses to still be higher and many of your comments highlight things we continue to address. The key areas that parents raised differing opinions or questions about in the comments section were as follows: pastoral support for those who struggle with the behaviour system, what their child is learning at any point during the year, communication (response rates and daily queries), lack of detail within the student reports and wider personal development and what this means. Over the next few weeks, I will address each of these in turn and let you know where we are and where we are going.

You might like to see the section below entitled Wider Personal Development which lists the events and activities that take place weekly across the year groups.

I would like to thank all parents who responded to my notices about driving on the school site. Things have improved but speed around the campus is still a concern. Parents are requested to drive at no more than 5 mph around the site as this poses a risk to students' safety.

We are coming up to recruitment season in schools and while we are very lucky to have a specialised and experienced body of teachers at Abbey College, we would welcome conversations with any parent who may be considering, or knows someone who may be considering, training to teach in the future.



Teaching and learning update?

In Abbey College lessons we are focusing on developing challenge through insisting on full sentence answers, as this supports students' language skills as well as developing knowledge. We know that not all young people like to express themselves fully but do encourage them to practise this skill at home; it will support any future interviews and work placements, in addition to their lessons in school.

Assessment: How your child is doing?

- Year 7 and 8 students will be completing reading tests in English lessons in the week beginning 13.03.23. Students cannot prepare for these tests other than by reading at home and school.
- Year 11 Trials are ongoing. Please support students by encouraging them to revise and testing them on work they have learnt. Check that they have all of the revision guides that they need. It is not too late to order revision guides from Mrs Glen.
- **Year 10** reports were published as planned on Friday despite ongoing technical issues. Thank you for your patience.
- Year 13 Trials begin on 13.03.23. These assessments are important to establish accurate current grades. Edulink has a countdown in the exams section to the A level exams and they are very close now. Year 13 students often have part-time jobs and are sometimes put under pressure to work longer hours. Please support students in their revision, discuss their priorities with them and ensure that they get plenty of rest.
- Edulink is our main communication platform. If you are having connection issues with Edulink please contact <u>help@CMAT.support</u>. For other issues please contact the <u>office@abbeycollege.cambs.sch.uk</u>. We are currently looking at parental usage and will be contacting all parents who are yet to log onto Edulink to offer support.
