Foreword

As next week is much shortened, there will be no update from me. Therefore, this week, I will use the opportunity to avoid sharing anything new, but to simply remind families of what has been recently shared.

I am delighted to let you know that our summer uniform has been decided upon based on your feedback from the recent consultation. Please see below:

- 1. After May half term, students will not be required to wear a blazer to school. All other requirements of our Uniform Policy will remain in place.
- 2. If the weather is forecast to be in excess of 28 degrees, then we will contact parents to offer students the option of wearing their PE kit instead of their full school uniform.

In addition, during the summer period, both outdoor shaded areas and indoor air-conditioned spaces are also available.

Please be reminded that best way to contact staff is via email. Please try to avoid calling the front office wherever possible. Please only call the main Reception number in an emergency or if a situation cannot wait, for example, if you need to inform your child of a change to travel arrangements for getting home. Teachers are unable to receive phone calls during the school day. If you do call the school, Reception staff will take a message and pass it to the person best suited to help you.

There is an expectation that staff will respond to you in a timely manner. May I request that, if you email a member of staff and don't receive a response within the timeframe stated within the policy, please use the Parent Forum Guarantee and I will follow this up.

The Parent Forum Guarantee gives all parents the right to speak directly to me, the Headteacher, within 24 hours, if you feel your question has not been answered by those you have already contacted.

High Expectations and Safety Safety

Unkindness, Conflict and Bullying

There is no place for unkindness of any kind at Abbey College. We encourage students to report any unkindness to the Student Support Team, either in person or via our online form. All reports are investigated by the behaviour team so we have a full understanding of the situation. These incidents generally fall into three categories:

- 1. **Unkindness:** When someone does something intentionally hurtful
- 2. **Conflict:** When both parties are involved in unkind or hurtful behaviour
- 3. **Bullying:** When someone repeatedly does something unkind and hurtful

Once our investigation is complete we put sanctions in place in line with our behaviour policy and students are supported to move forward, with measures put in place to support students where necessary. If you have any concerns about unkindness then please do report these via our <u>online</u> form.

Tik-Tok Trends



Assessment: How your child is doing?

- Year 7 and 8 assessment dates: the assessment period is being extended owing to the shortened weeks (additional bank holiday, strike days) which means that reports will now be issued in the week following May half term.
- Year 8 and the PASS survey (Pupil Attitudes to Self and School): students were extremely
 positive about their confidence in learning, their self-regard as a learner, their general work
 ethic, their perceived learning capability and their response to curriculum demands. They
 also scored themselves highly on their preparedness for learning and their attitudes to
 attendance and teachers.
