The Abbey College Spirit is the set of virtues that underpin our school community. Innovative and challenging learning


Teaching and learning is at the core of everything we do here at Abbey College. It ensures the development and learning of all students and secures their future pathway and life opportunities.



Junior Leadership Team (JLT)

One to one support for every student

At Abbey College, we offer our students an innovative and bespoke curriculum for each year group and provide them with stimulating teaching and learning experiences. Together, we have a strong commitment to a high standard of conduct that ensures the classroom focus remains on high-quality teaching and learning.

Our specialist teams of year group tutors led by their Raising Standards Lead will guide and support your child throughout their time at Abbey College. Through regular monitoring and tracking programmes, we ensure every student's progress is closely observed and shared with parents.

This is balanced with extensive and wide ranging extra-curricular and enrichment activities that encourage students to discover and develop their personal talents and a Sixth Form which offers both academic and vocational courses. Our Social Studies lessons, delivered by a team of specialist teachers, cover a wide range of Personal, Social and Health topics including unconscious racial bias, relationships and sex education and mental health issues.

Pastoral care

At Abbey College 'Every Child Matters', and we pride ourselves on our high standards of pastoral care. Each student is treated as an individual and supported to achieve the highest standards they are capable of.

Form tutors are the first port of call for any concerns a student has. Our Welfare Team are available to provide support during lunch and break time for identified students to manage their emotions, resolve conflicts effectively or simply to provide an opportunity for a quiet chat. There is also a reporting system on the school website.

We have also trained a small group of our students to act as peer mediators whose job it is to support students in overcoming conflict and friendship issues. The aim of this is to model positive problem solving skills, as well as preventing friendship problems from escalating into bullying.



Attendance

Our students' attendance is outstanding. We aim for 100% attendance for all students, placing the highest priority on excellent attendance and punctuality. These are essential factors that contribute to progress and achievement of high standards.

We have a strong attendance policy that clearly outlines our expectations in relation to achieving and rewarding the highest standards of attainment.

Combined Cadet Force

Abbey College offers a unique opportunity to take part in a Combined Cadet Force (CCF) contingent. There are only 500 units in UK state schools and our CCF has operated an Army section since 2019. Students are able to take CCF as an option subject in Year 9.

CCF is a Government sponsored initiative enabling schools to work in partnership with the Ministry of Defence (MOD) in order to offer a unique and incredible opportunity for young people. It is about learning and developing new skills, offering unique and challenging opportunities and having fun. Taught with a military ethos, cadets follow a training programme and have the opportunity to gain several qualifications.

Students have the opportunity to achieve QAVS qualifications, like BTEC in Teamwork and Personal Skills and the Institute of Leadership and Management's Award in Leadership; as well as St John's Ambulance First Aid qualifications.

The skills/subject that are taught are:

- Drill & Turnout
- Military Knowledge
- Skill At Arms (Rifle Training)
- Shooting
- Map & Compass
- First Aid
- Fieldcraft
- Adventurous Activities & Challenging Pursuits
- Method of Instruction

As Cadets learn and progress through each topic, they achieve badges which they can wear on their uniform to show their achievements and skill levels. Cadets will complete the Basic APC Certificate within the first year, and the advanced APC Certificate within the second. The APC Training Syllabus is progressive and becomes more challenging, with students learning more advanced skills and knowledge throughout the programme.

Cadets are taught to work as a team and respect one another. Cadets have opportunities to take part in weekend exercises where they can practice their field craft and navigation skills.

Every year students also have the opportunity to take part in an Annual Camp during the summer term, including various activities such as military skills as well as Outdoor activities (climbing, kayaking, mountain biking etc.). Camps take place in various locations in the UK and abroad and give students a chance to get together with a wide-range of other students from schools across the UK.



Partnerships for learning

Primary school partnership

There is a strong bond between all of our primary schools and Abbey College, and it is something we take great pride in. We have a transition programme in place that allows students to spend a period of time within the Abbey, developing their personal skills, knowledge and experiences whilst also getting a real taste for the outstanding teaching and learning that takes place. Our staff regularly visit our primary schools to build on their own experiences so that they are better equipped when the new intake of students arrives. We take great pride in having primary schools visit us during the academic year for a series of whole school events, from our annual Remembrance Service and Sports Day. All learners have a dedicated team around them, which includes a Raising Standards Lead, Form Tutor and Student Support Officers, who are there to support each and every child on a daily basis.

Careers Education, Information, Advice and Guidance (CEIAG)

We support our students in making well-informed decisions through our comprehensive and high quality careers programme, and access to independent information and guidance about the range of options open to them. Being an integral part of students education across all years, our programme aims to raise aspirations, irrespective of age, background, ability or SEND, preparing them for their time at Abbey College and in the future.



Parent participation
