*Happy New Year! I hope that you all had a fantastic Christmas break.*

*We are back in the swing of the Spring term and have hit the ground running. The revision programmes for Year 11 are in full swing and parents will be aware that on the back of the results, changes have been made to some teaching groups and intervention sessions. A reminder that after-school Maths Interact sessions take place each and every Tuesday from 3:15-4:10pm and students can book on the late bus if required. The sessions are targeted, and students are invited to attend if we noted the topic was a weakness in the recent Trial exams. This is the same for English and Science which take place on Monday and Wednesday respectively. In addition, these three subjects also run general revision sessions for Year 11 pupils on the same evenings, so everyone is welcome.*

*Keeping with Year 11s, we hosted an event in-school to share information about the world of apprenticeships, using external speakers. We are very aware that this is a growing market and the demand for places is becoming challenging. Our aim is to ensure that all Year 11s have all the information they need to make the best possible choice for their future destination.*

*Moreover, this term Year 8 will be making important decisions regarding the subjects they wish to go on and study at Key Stage 4. Parents are invited to an evening on 9th February between 4:30-7:30pm where the process will be explained.*

*Year 7 are learning about the instruments within an Orchestra using the topic of Harry Potter. They have all had the opportunity to experience playing the Violin where they have learnt how to play a pizzicato as an ensemble.*

*As requested by our Parent Forum, we intend to reach out to those families who have never used Edulink to support them in accessing the various school communication systems. Families who have not logged onto Edulink will be contacted within the next two weeks to arrange an appointment should it be necessary.*

*Finally, as stated last term, we have begun the process of surveying families about our school, one year group at a time. Once we have collated the results, I will respond to the most common themes. A summary of the meeting is below.

- *Toilet concerns: Toilets are open at form time, break, lunch and at the end of the day. They can also be used quickly during lesson changeover leaving only an hour at a time when students are asked not to use toilets. It is disruptive to lessons if students leave and there have been behavioural issues, so for safeguarding reasons, students are asked not to use the toilets during lesson time. Any students with medical needs have a toilet pass and can go anytime. Students were reminded during assemblies last week and provided with a small card for their pockets with bathroom locations. There will be a site walk with students and the Parent Forum to review the facilities.*
- *The canteen and lunchtime arrangements: Chris Berry the Canteen Manager spoke at the meeting and explained the rationale behind the pricing and the menu. In addition, Mrs Noble detailed the locations students are able to eat indoors and socialise outdoors.*
- *The Wellbeing space for students in the Quad: Mrs Gerrard-Cook showed the design for the Wellbeing space and is in the process of costing out the project for implementation this year.*
