The key to being a successful language learner is to practise the language little and often. Start doing these things today to ensure you get the grade you want at the end of your GCSE.

- Practice vocabulary: keep a vocabulary book, start making vocabulary flashcards or practise online using memrise or auizlet. It doesn't matter which method you decide to use, just start doing it now! It is impossible to cram for a language exam. Aim to do 10-15 minutes of vocabulary minimum 2 or 3 times a week to ensure you are confident for the exam.
- **Grammar:** learn your verb endings. Test yourself weekly. Again you could make flashcards or go online to practise. Grammar is key to been able to communicate in the writing & speaking exams.
- Make revision notes: when you finish a unit make a mind map of language/phrases you could use in your writing & speaking exams
- **Be organised:** Keep your books tidy & any hand outs organised. This will make your life much easier when it comes to revision time.
- Use your Spanish: Read newspapers/magazines online. Listen to Spanish music. Watch Spanish films/programmes (there are lots available on Netflix. Speak Spanish. You can only get better at a language by practising it!
